

Proposition 42
Traffic Congestion Relief for Counties

Fiscal Year 2000-01

Chapter 91, Statutes of 2000 (Assembly Bill 2928), amended by Chapter 626, Statutes of 2000 (Senate Bill 1662) required a one-time allocation of \$400,000,000 to cities and counties for Transportation Congestion Relief. This one time allocation took place on October 13, 2000 and counties received their 50% or \$200,000.

Fiscal Year 2003-04 County Allocation

In FY 2003-04 and 2004-05 the State retained Proposition 42 monies as a loan. Cities and Counties were repaid the total amount of Prop. 42 monies withheld as a loan in the 2006-07 State budget. The loan repayment allocation for FY 2003-04 monies was on August 1, 2006 and counties received approximately \$100 million as noted below.

Fiscal Year 2004-05 County Allocation

In FY 2003-04 and 2004-05 the State retained Proposition 42 monies as a loan. Cities and Counties were repaid the total amount of Prop. 42 monies withheld as a loan in the 2006-07 State budget. The loan repayment allocation for FY 2004-05 monies was on August 2, 2006 and counties received their 50% as noted below.
