**Payment Deferral** 

Dear Honorable Controller John Chiang,

The **Glenn County Board of Supervisors** is writing to express our strong opposition to your proposal to defer payments to our County for the month of February. We also strongly oppose the budget proposal that could defer other revenue up to seven (7) months. There are very few counties in California that can sustain a lack of repayment for one month let alone multiple months. In particular we want to bring too your attention the devastating impact such deferrals will have on our small rural county. We are already under great stress due to the fact that mental health payments are delayed on a normal basis, even though our requests for payment are filed timely, the payments are not remitted timely.

To keep you and others informed of the facts about the impact these deferrals would have on Glenn County, let us provide the following information for clarity:

## **Proposed Deferrals**

Gas Tax	\$1,103,566
Social Services	\$8,404,144
<u>Health</u>	\$2,341,567
Total	\$11,848,277

Glenn County Total General Fund Budget \$27,000,000 Glenn County General Fund Reserve \$706,000

Glenn County must continue to fund the Social Services and Health programs with County General Funds in order to protect the County from sanctions as well as provide essential services to the needy. As these numbers clearly indicate, your proposal would cripple our County's ability to provide even basic service to our citizens and force the County to close our doors the day you actually put into effect your deferral.

Therefore we request that you grant Glenn County an exemption based upon the hardship or based upon the past practice of exempting small counties with a population of less than 40,000.

While we understand the crisis situation the State of California is in, it would do little good to force Glenn County into bankruptcy. We stand ready willing and able to assist in formulating a solution that works for all.
