Both Houses Conclude 2012-13 Budget Work

The Senate and Assembly today approved the package of budget trailer bills required to enact the 2012-13 budget. The Governor has until midnight tonight to sign the main 2012-13 budget bill (AB 1464), which was passed by the Legislature on June 15. He has 12 days to sign the budget trailer bills that were passed today.

CSAC staff are working to summarize the key provisions of interest to counties contained in the 21 bills approved by the Legislature today. Keep in mind that many of these bills run hundreds of pages, but we plan to have additional information circulated to counties by Friday. We thank you for your patience.

We now await the action of the Governor on the bills and the extent to which he exercises his blue pencil authority.

We would note that the redevelopment bill (AB 1484), which was the subject of much discussion during the Senate budget committee last night was heard again in that committee this morning. It passed both the Senate budget committee and both houses of the Legislature today with no further amendments. As for realignment, the permanent fiscal structure and key county-by-county allocation will be enacted as part of the fiscal superstructure bill (SB 1020).
