As a result of civil lawsuits settled by the California Attorney General, funds are available to support technology related projects and to purchase computer and technology equipment from the CRT Settlement Fund. The grant process will be administered by Harry M. Snyder, CRT Settlement Fund Administrator.

Applications must be submitted electronically no later than 5:00 PM PDT, Friday, July 15, 2016. To learn more, click here.

There are four separate funds under the CRT Settlement Fund. To understand the differences and eligibility requirements for each fund, potential applicants are encouraged to carefully read the detailed information and criteria below.

- 1.Settlement Class Fund: Any California local government entity, the University of California, and the State Bar of California may apply for funds for the purchase of technological items representing the next generation after CRTs.
- 2.State Agency Fund: Any California state agency (excluding the University of California and the State Bar of California) may apply for funds for the purchase of technological items representing the next generation after CRTs.
- 3. Deadweight Loss Fund: Any California state or local government entity (including public universities and colleges), publicprivate laboratory, or nonprofit organization for advocacy/research on increasing competition in technological industries, or research or best practices on the implementation and use of new technologies beyond CRTs.
- 4. Residual Fund: Any California nonprofit organization for provision of computer or technology related services that increase access, skills and knowledge to various communities.

NOTE: Applicants can apply to more than one fund, but cannot submit more than one application per fund, and must submit separate applications for each funding request.
