





EZRA KLEIN

WASHINGTON POST POLITICAL COLUMNIST



Ezra Klein is a columnist for The Washington Post and Bloomberg and oversees “Wonkblog” at The Washington Post. He is a regular contributor and policy analyst for MSNBC where his commentary focuses on as Klein describes it “domestic and economic

policy-making, as well as the political system that’s constantly screwing it up.”

Prior to joining *The Washington Post* and *Bloomberg*, Klein was an associate editor at *The American Prospect* and a columnist at *Newsweek*. In addition to appearing and hosting on MSNBC, he has also appeared on *Charlie Rose*, *Real Time with Bill Maher*, *The McLaughlin Group*, *The Colbert Report* and many more. *The Economist* named him one of the “Minds of the Moment.”

In 2010, Klein was named Blogger of the Year by both *The Week* magazine and the Sidney Hillman Foundation for his extensive coverage of the healthcare debate and Congress’ passage of the Affordable Care Act.


His unconventional and innovative views on business and leadership have attracted international attention and have earned him invitations to meet with leaders and organizations in a wide array of industries.

is centered on his fundamental belief that each person and every organization has the potential to achieve outstanding results.


With a master’s degree in counseling psychology and a bachelor’s degree in business administration, he has found a way to make complex ideas simple, memorable and immediately applicable.
