Program to employ underserved youth across the state to help address urgent challenges in California while participants learn key job skills, develop career pathways, and engage with their communities.

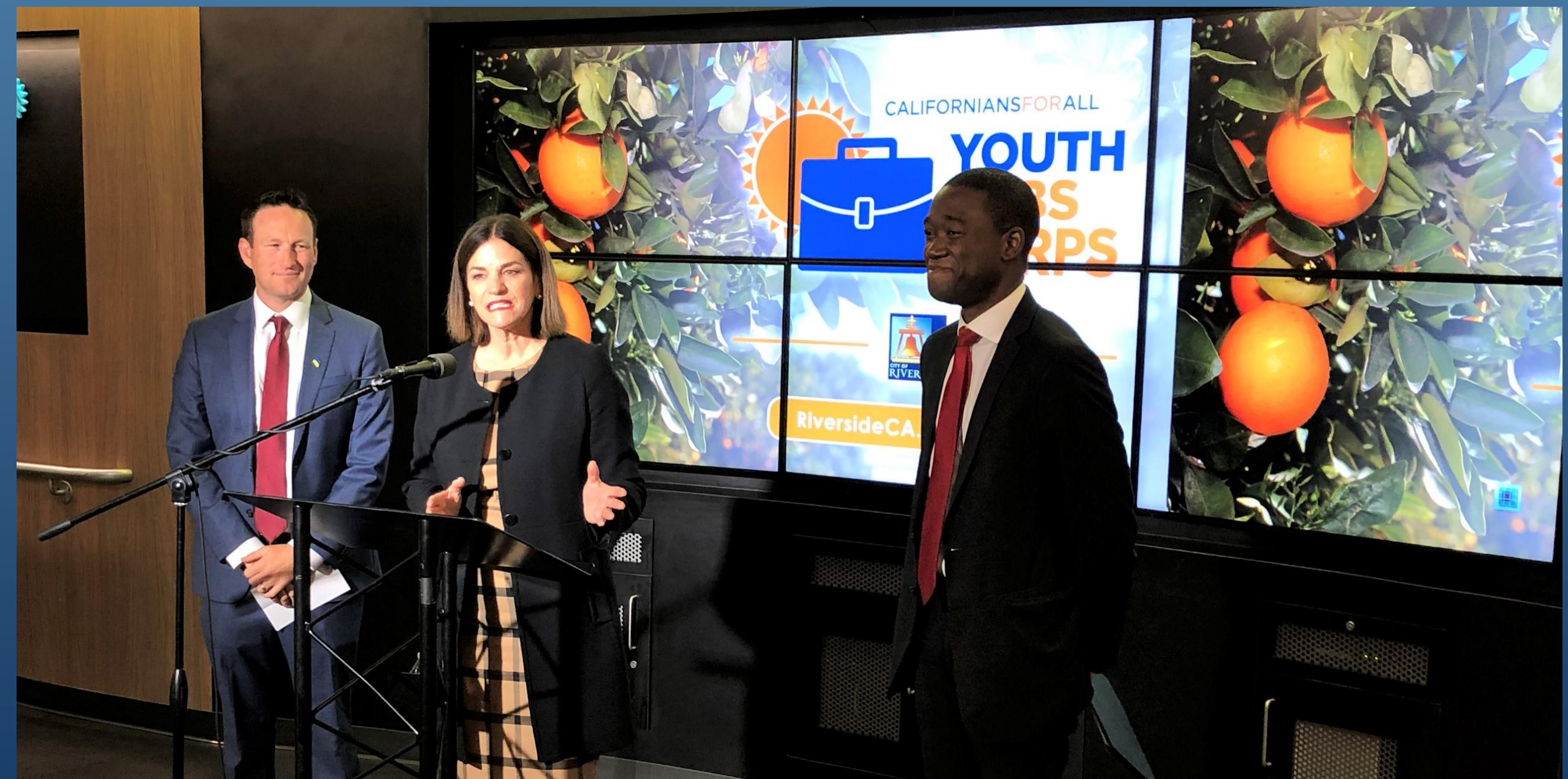
**This program focuses on Californians aged 16-30 who are:**

# #CaliforniansForAll College Corps

- Create debt-free pathways to college for students who commit to serve their community (California GI Bill)
- 6,500 Fellows over the next two years (roughly size of the Peace Corps)
- Includes AB 540 California Dream Act Students

- 1 Create a generation of civic-minded leaders with the ability to bridge divides and solve problems.
- 2 Help low-income students graduate college on time, with less debt, social networks, and professional skills.
- 3 Address societal challenges and help build more equitable communities across California.
